ATTENDED FUNERAL (funeral director's charges only)	£1575
This is a funeral where family and friends have a ceremony, event or service for the deceased the same time as they attend their burial or cremation.	d person at
 Taking care of all necessary legal and administrative arrangements 	£550
 Collecting and transporting the deceased person from the place of death (normally within 15 miles of the funeral director's premises) into the funeral director's care, this fee also includes care and preparation of the deceased up to the funeral service date. 	£180

UNATTENDED FUNERAL	
This is a funeral where family and friends may choose to have a ceremony, event or service for the deceased person, but they do not attend the burial or cremation itself.

For an Attended or Unattended burial funeral, the burial fee . ¹	54-£2260

For a new grave, you will also need to pay for the plot. If this is a council owned cemetery they may charge for an Exclusive Right Certificate , this is paid for at the time of purchase. For an existing grave with a memorial in place, you may need to pay a removal/replacement fee. In addition, the cemetery may charge a number of other fees.

¹ This fee (which is sometimes called the interment fee) is the charge made for digging and closing a new grave, or for reopening and closing an existing grave.

² In England, Wales and Northern Ireland, you will usually need to pay doctors' fees as well. This is the charge for two doctors to sign the Medical Certificates for Cremation.
